WHAT IS A CASE STATEMENT?

A Well-Crafted Case Statement is:

- Visually appealing and captures the reader's attention
- A logical progression of ideas and full of facts
- Always positive and inspirational in tone
- Compelling, dramatic, and urgent in nature



What is a Case Statement?

A Case Statement is:

- The official story of a fundraising effort
- A logical argument for eliciting support for needs at the academy
- A sales tool for recruitment, solicitation, and marketing
- An educational tool about the organization

A Case Statement is <u>not</u>:

- A school brochure
- The existing mission statement,
 vision statement, or strategic plan
- A substitute for personal "witness" and personal asking

Why Do You Need a Case Statement

- Donors want to know how they can make an impact
- Donors want to help solve your problems sharing your needs is an important piece of this
- Donors want clarity on where their funds go and what they do
- Fundraising is competitive an attractive document that showcases the unique value proposition will give you a competitive edge.

- How well we do it achievements and milestones
- What we see ahead vision and/or forces of change/challenge
- What we're faced with the compelling reason or need to support the School

- What we're going to do about it the plan to meet the needs or challenges
- How we're going to do it the remedy; what we'll do with the money
- How we're going to get there financing plan to meet the needs
- What are the expected benefits goals and desired objectives, position
- How you can help the invitation and reason why donors should care

■ Rich History:

Immigrants' Dreams and Strong Faith Serve as a Foundational Pillar of IMMAC

It started with a dream shared by a large population of new immigrants to the United States (Irish, German, Poles, Italians, Czechoslovakians) --- the development of a church and school. The dream was realized when our doors opened in 1924 and almost a century later, IMMAC remains a highly sought-after educational institution by families in our multigenerational and multi-ethnic Astoria community.

Shaping the lives of our young children for many generations with devout dedication was our beloved religious community – including teachers and principals such as the Sisters of the Holy Union of Fall River Massachusetts (at IMMAC for 56 years), parish pastors and priests, such as the Reverend Monsignor Fernando Ferrarese, (at IMMAC since 2008) and continuing the tradition, our new Principal, Brother Joseph Rocco, sc, Ed.D., a member of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart, one of only 3 religious principals in the Diocese of Brooklyn/Queens.

Faith-filled, the religious community educated hearts, souls, and minds, and gave their students a superb foundation from which to grow and serve others. They opened eyes and opened doors to opportunities these children may never have known.

Our objective is to educate the "whole child", by challenging them academically, deepening their faith in God and encouraging and supporting their personal growth.

Our IMMAC family of faculty and staff cultivates an environment where all students are challenged to reach their potential by celebrating their unique gifts and talents – while feeling safe and nurtured in a positive classroom environment.

Our Academy serves Nursery through 8th grade students of all faiths and reflects the rich diversity of our surrounding community.

■ Sustaining Vision:

Growing a Thriving Affordable Catholic Educational Institution

Our long-term goal is to promote, sustain and grow a primary education environment grounded in Catholic identity, where key stakeholders (including parents, teachers, administration, parish priests, the community, and alumni) partner to deliver support and encourage the academic, spiritual and personal growth of our students, preparing them for a successful transition to high school and life.

The Academy is blessed to be a part of the vibrant parish of the Immaculate Conception Church a diverse family united in our faith in Jesus Christ and reflective of Gospel values rooted in love, faith and prayer and committed to living the Gospel.

Our Academy promotes intellectual curiosity, creativity, personal growth and faith. Rooted in a tradition of high standards in academics, athletics, and service to others, students are challenged to excel by our dedicated teachers and competitive curriculum.

Early Childhood Programs: We offer *Just* the *Two of Us*, a Toddler Program for children from 18 to 30 months and their parents/caregivers, a full or half-day Nursery program for 3-year olds and a fullday Pre-K for All program.

Classrooms are equipped with SmartBoards and students have access to I-Pads, Chrome Books and Google Classroom. Our new STEM Lab opened during 2018-19 school year.

■ Driving Objective:

Graduate Well-educated, Balanced and Happy Children

The sacrifices of many who make our Academy unique and special are rewarded by the success of our students:

- Graduating self-fulfilled, balanced young adults best prepared to take on the challenges of high school and life
- Transforming the student from early childhood to young adults with encouragement to respect self and others and be productive citizens and future leaders
- Graduates who attend top high schools (and receive monetary academic scholarships)

■ Immediate Challenges:

Family Employment Displacements and Rising Operating Costs

Our immediate challenge we face is the need to support our families (current and prospective) who are faced with a variety of employment difficulties. During these uncertain times, many families are struggling financially, so obtaining the "whole" education of their child at a Catholic school is an aspirational dream.

- Family Challenges: COVID-19 drove working parents to be furloughed and displaced permanently or for periods uncertain.
- Academy challenges: Increases in operating budget due the unexpected expense of COVID-19 supplies/protocols to ensure our students, faculty and staff are in a safe and healthy environment along with the loss of essential *in*person fund-raising events, limited due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Solutions:

Raise funds to Supplement Tuition of Financially-Challenged Families

The IMMAC family is embarking upon an effort to substantially increase the funds available in our **Immaculate Mary Award Program (IMAP)**

IMAP is an endowment-like fund created for the exclusive objective of helping families who are unable to afford IMMAC's full tuition commitment.

Funded by the generous support of patrons such as yourselves - Alumni and Friends of IMMAC - IMAP extends financial awards to families who have recently been financially challenged to maintain their current tuition payments. The **Program** also provides support to families of potential new students who without an **Award** would not be able to consider attending IMMAC.

Award amounts are based on financial need as evidenced by tax documents, unemployment letters, and the in-person testimony of our families. Our Academy expects the families to contribute some amount to the stated tuition amount.

During these unprecedented times, more families need help, therefore we turn to our Alumni and Friends of IMMAC to open their hearts and welcome the opportunity to support this lifechanging **Program**. All gift amounts are welcome! Gifts over \$10,000 may be made in recognition of a living or deceased loved one, e.g., **The Immaculate Mary – John and Rose Jones Award**.
